









Nono was a clever, hard-working girl who lived with her aunt. Aunt was not very kind to Nono. She made Nono do a lot of housework.

Nono smiled a huge smile. "I'll call you Thuphazana because you are the size of my thumb. Come into my pocket so my aunt won't see you."






"Today I'll wash the dishes for you, Nono," said Thuphazana. "You can rest."

Aunt knocked. "Nono! What's all that noise?"


Nono was petrified. "Nothing, Aunt. I was just dreaming."


"Come and sleep with me if you're having bad dreams," Aunt said.


"I am fine, Aunt," Nono replied.

"My Thuphazana, is that you?" Nono called out.








"Yes, Nono!" a voice answered.

"Now is the time, Having a friend, Together we fetch, together we plough, Times have changed!"


