
Lwando has a little sister named Oyiso.

a monster.




That's okay, because Lwando is a

monster tamer.




On Monday, the monster looked **angry.**

But Lwando knew she was just **hungry.**




On Tuesday, the monster looked

The monsters got **bigger**.


RAWWWWR!

And bigger.




