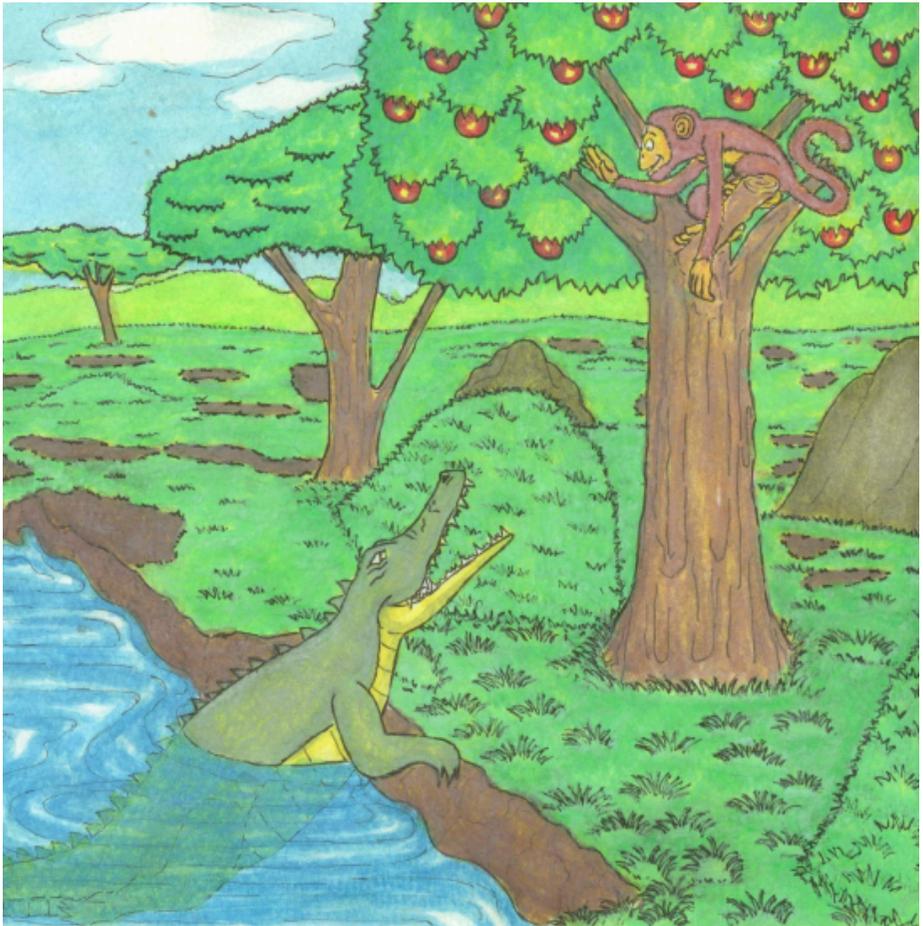




Crocodile and Monkey were friends

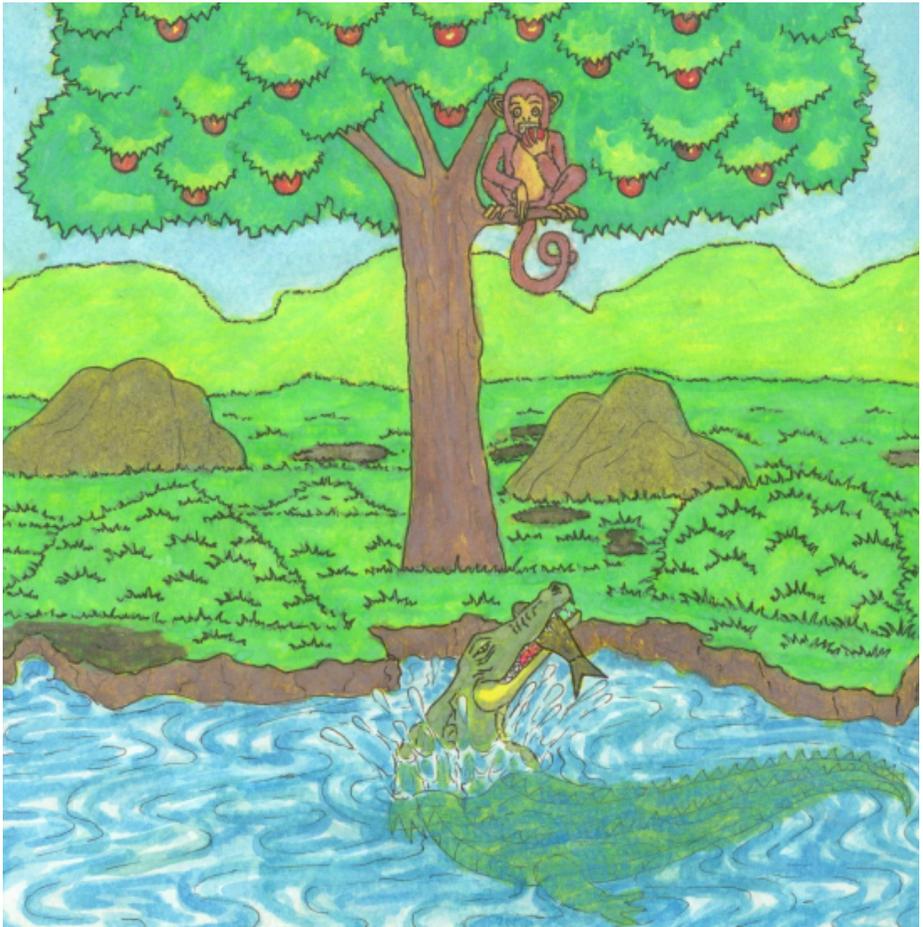




Crocodile and Monkey were best friends.

Monkey lived in a tree next to the river.



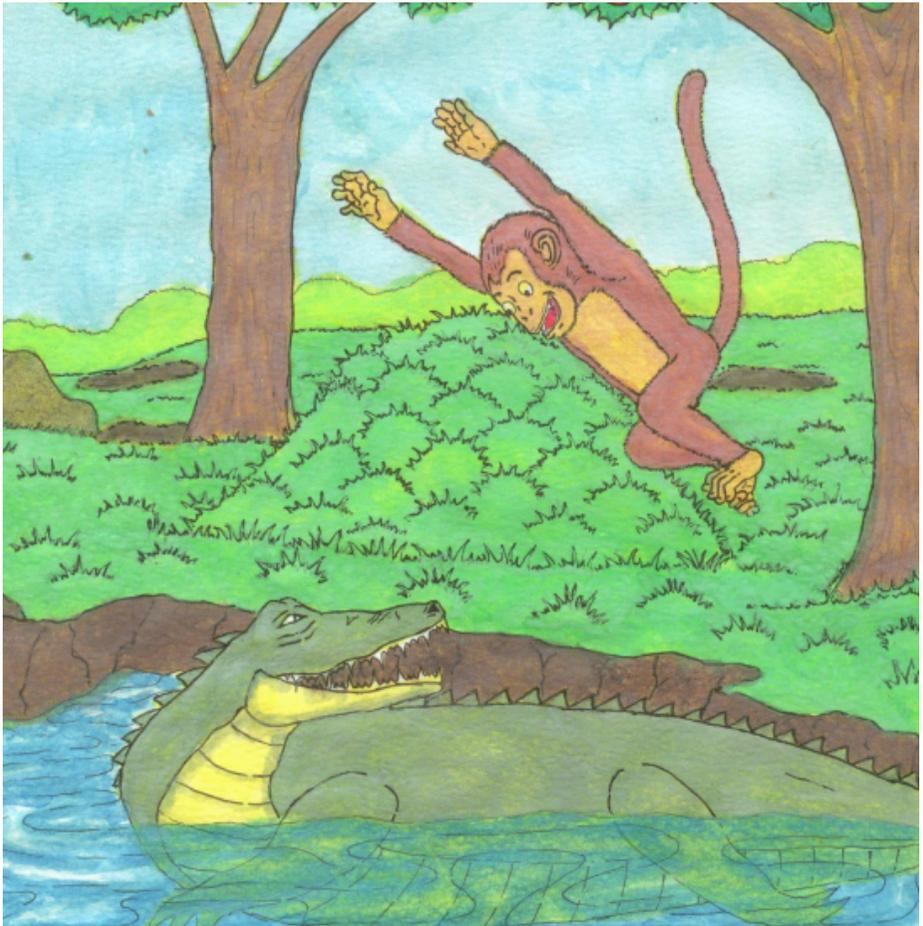
Crocodile ate fish from the river.

Crocodile's Grandmother told her, "Only a monkey's liver will cure the child."



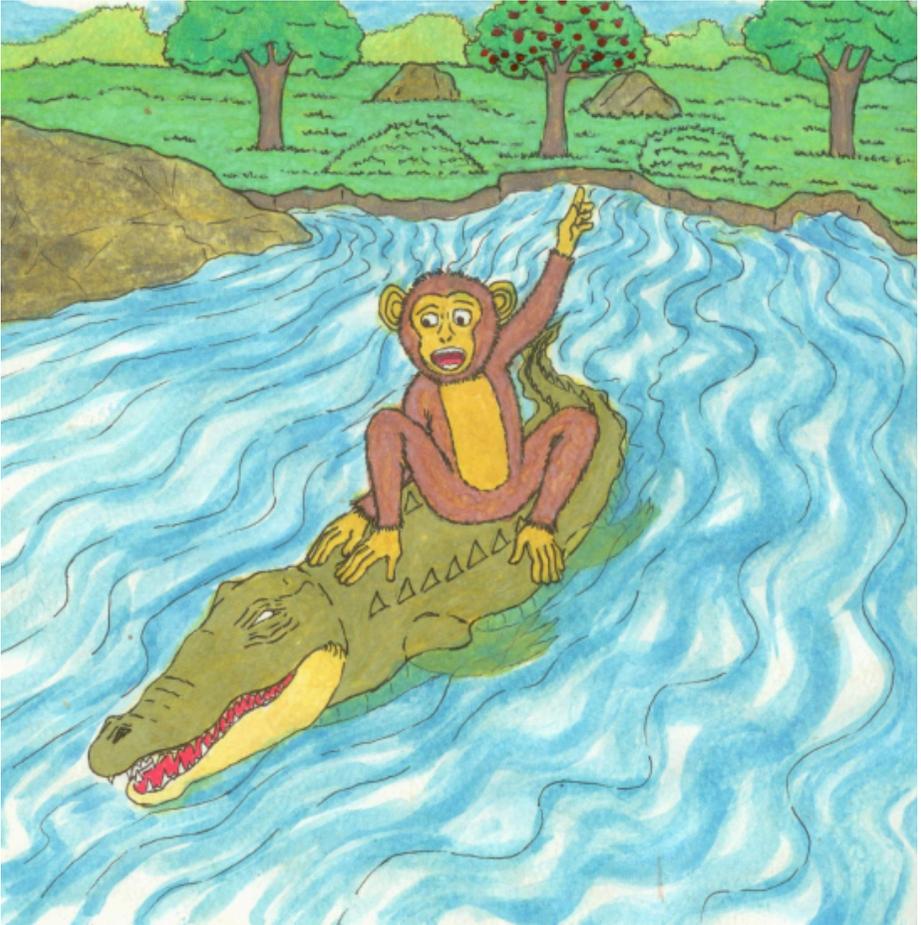
Crocodile invited Monkey to her house in the river.
