Die voëltjies se mamma het 'n pragtige stem gehad! Sy het elkeoggend vroeg wakker geword om haar lied te sing.










Maar eendag het 'n droogte die land

blare het van die bome afgeval.








Mamango het lank en diep gedink.

bring gaan haal.


Maar wie sal gaan?”

haar pad huis toe vind?







“Kom ons sing Mamma se lied,”

Geel toe Mamma se liedjie:


“Dis 'n liefflikeoggend!
