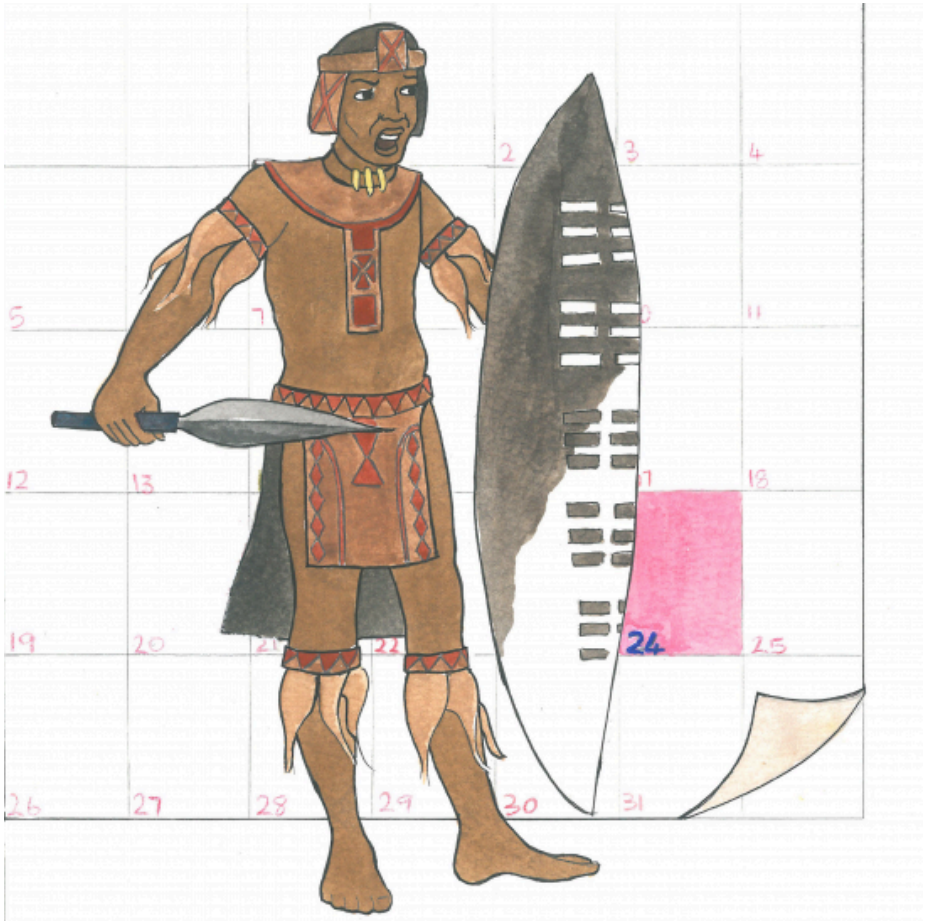

Re ipshina gape le ka go apea dijo tša rena tša setšo.

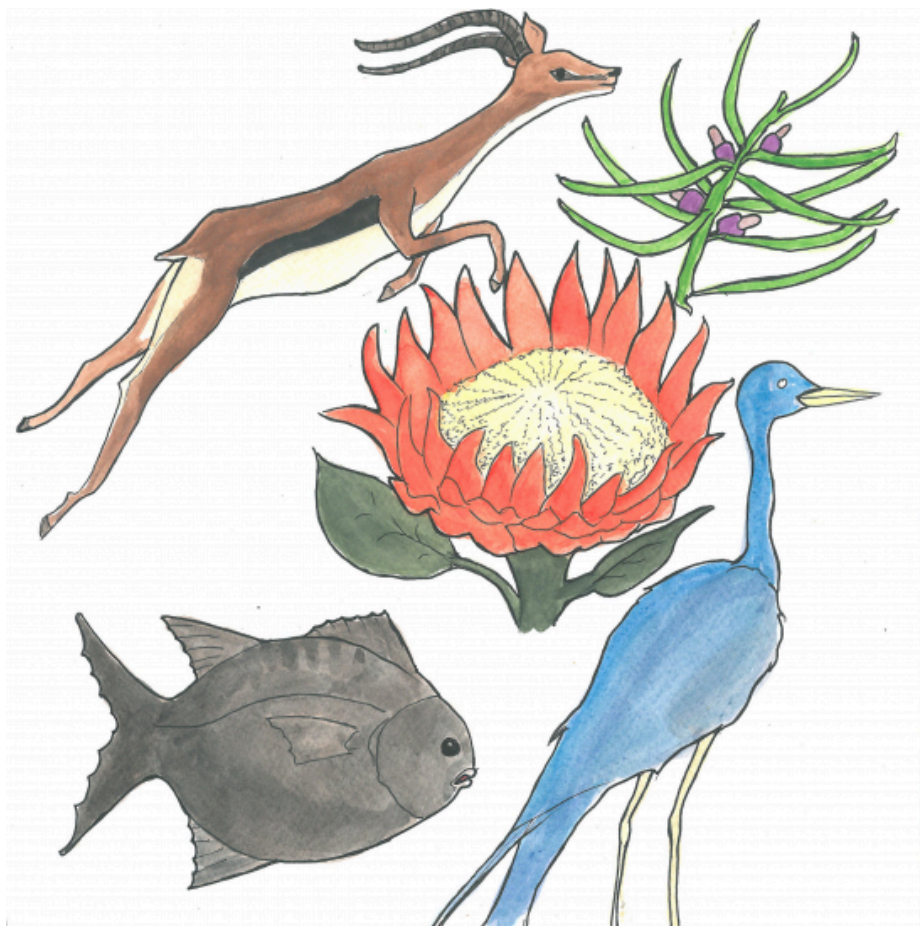
