

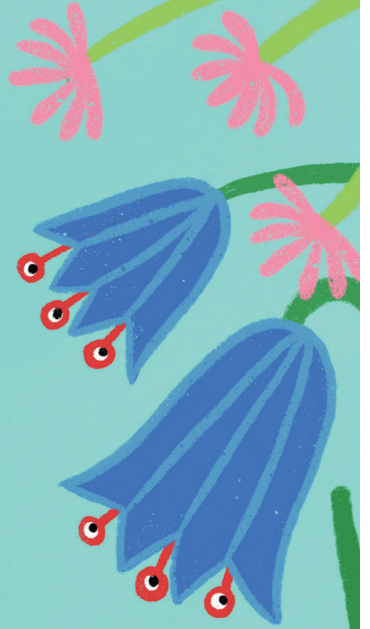


Ouma's amazing flowers

opens her curtains.

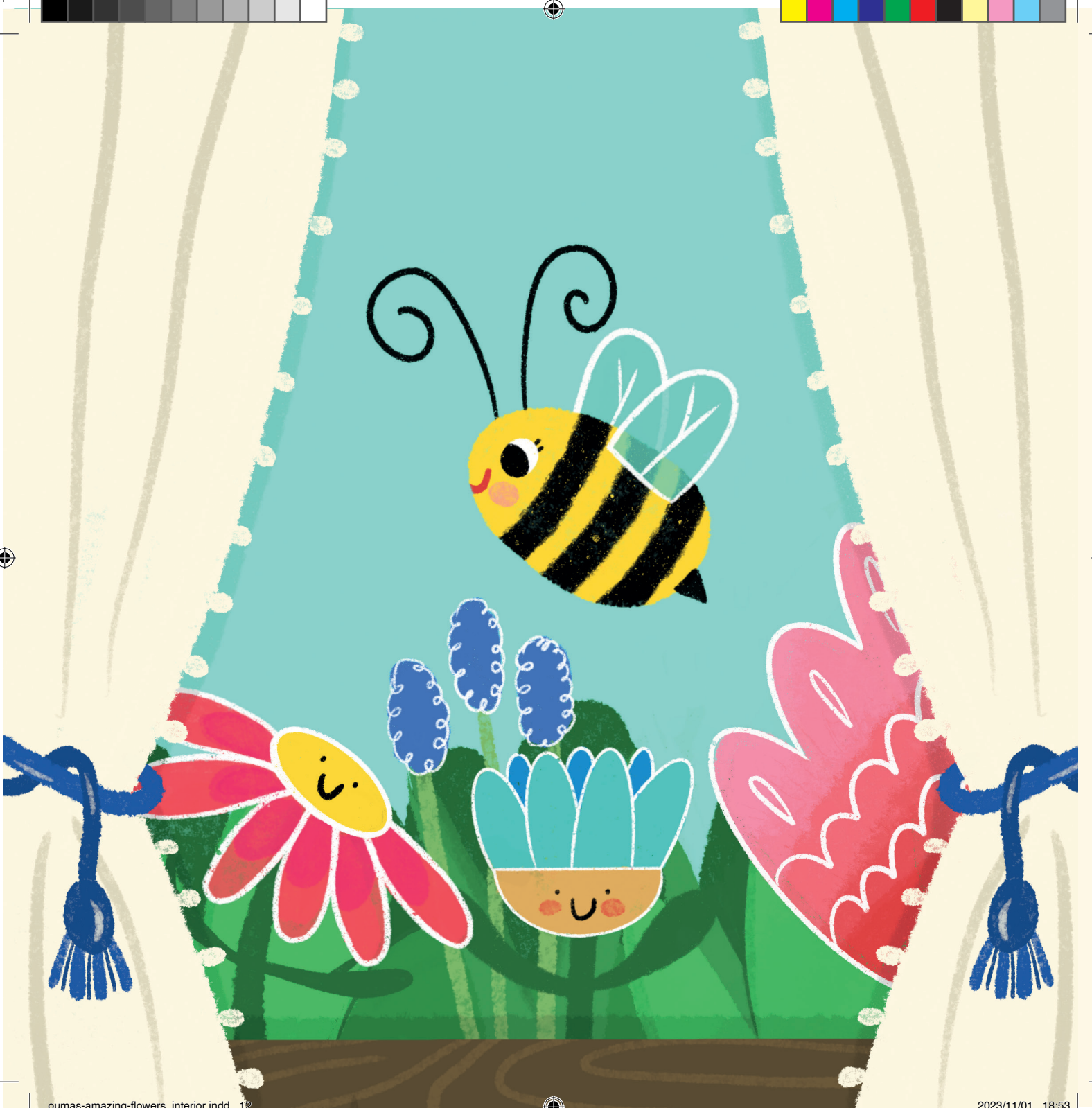




Butterflies dance

She feels a little bit sad!

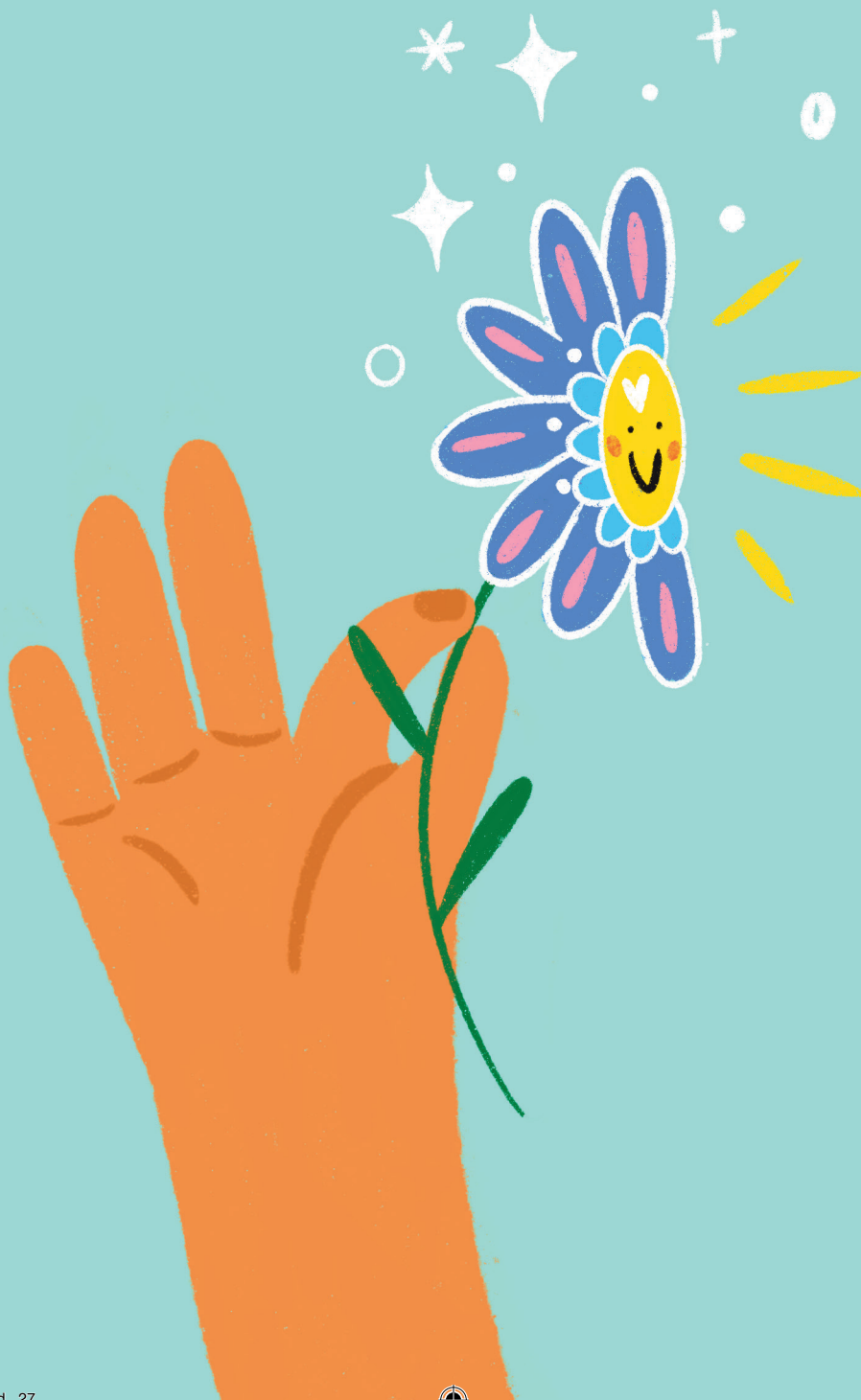


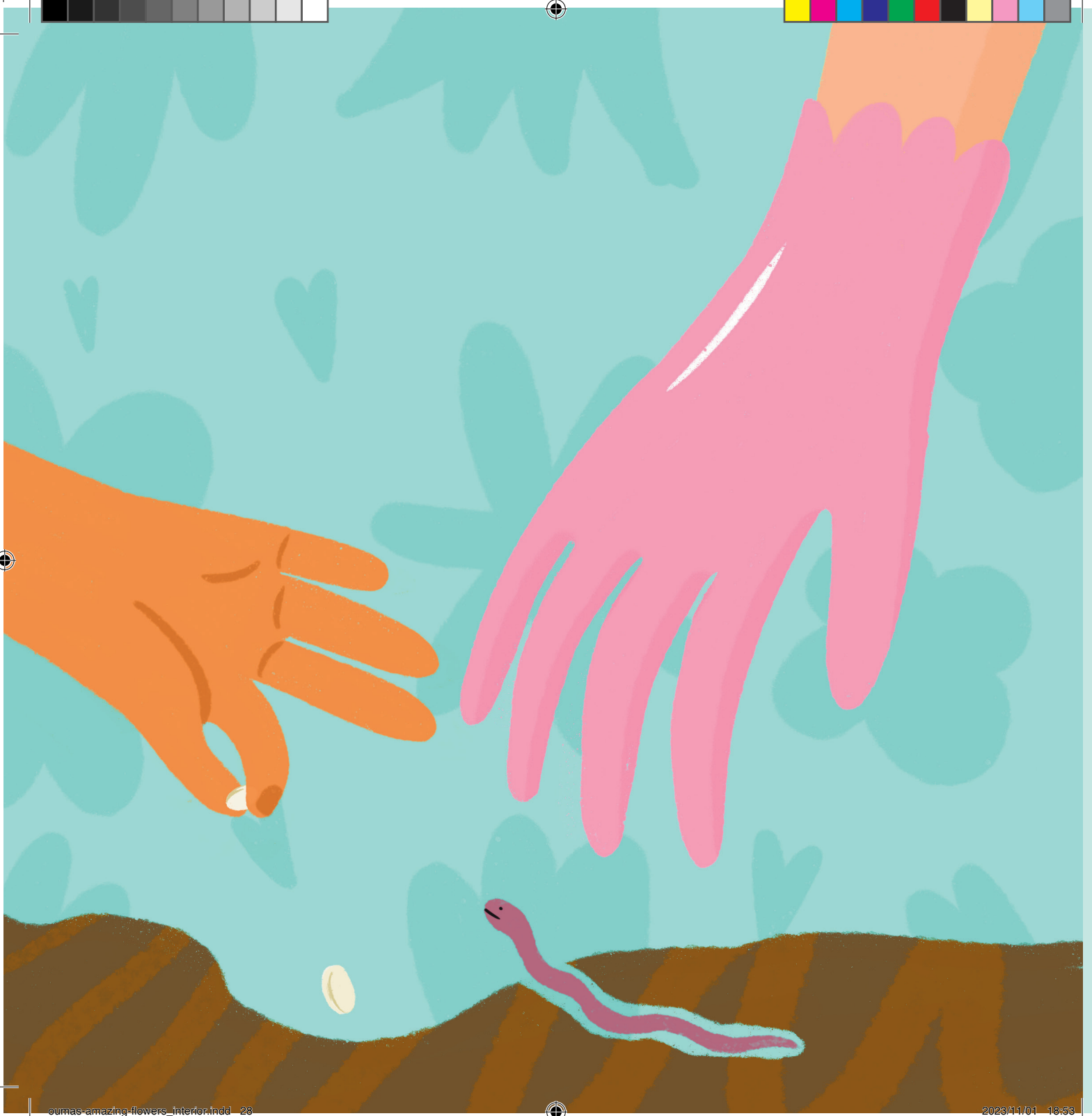


Ouma doesn't want
